**Search Form:** The Search Form has fields for a date or range of dates during which clients applied to the program. You can enter a date for:

- “all applications after this date” or
- “all applications before this date” or
- “all applications between these two dates”

Next, choose a Borough (NYC) or special program (such as Retirement Subsidy). If your TBFProgram is TBFW (Westchester), then choose Westchester.

As an extra option, you can enter the name of a city in the selected borough or Westchester, such as Jamaica if you have selected Queens or New Rochelle in Westchester.

If you leave all fields blank, the report will include all clients in the database. This is a problem if some clients are in both a special program (Income Growth) AND a borough client with a different ClientID.

The footer on the Search Form warns about this:

### Caution: AVOID double counting and Missing Data

- If you select Westchester, but TBFProgram is TBFNYC, no data will be found.
- If you select a NYC Borough but TBFProgram is TBFW, no data will be found
- If you select a NYC Borough and a Special Program, you will double count clients who are in both the borough and the program.
- If you select NOTHING, the total will double count all clients in special programs who are also listed as borough clients.
- To see Totals of ALL NYC Boroughs, select each borough with a checkbox.

Also, to help prevent such a mistake, if you select Westchester or a Borough, the options for the special programs will be hidden. But, if you select nothing, this error can still occur.

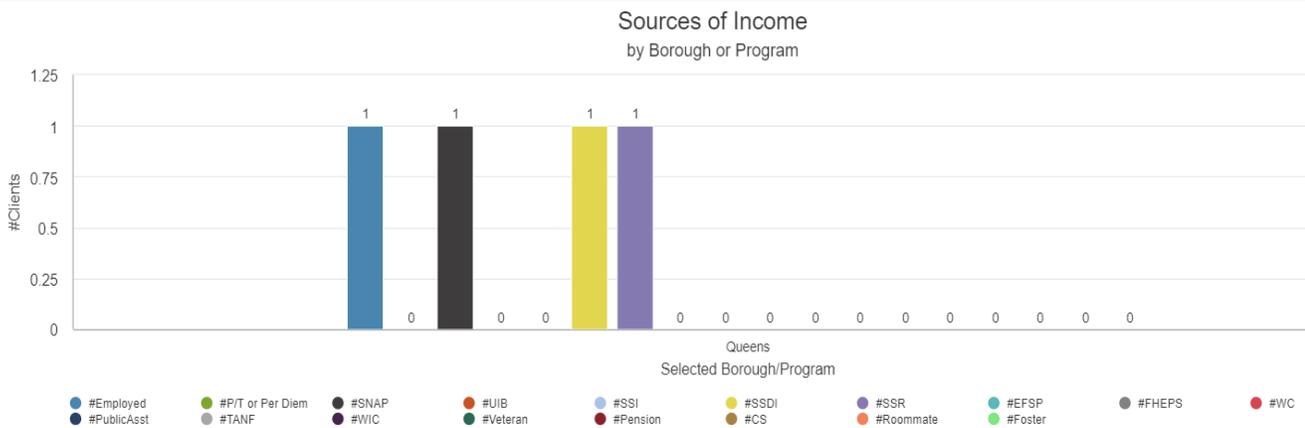
Here is an example of a search. Notice that because we selected Queens, the special program options are no longer visible:

Include all of the year 2020 in our search.

Select Queens as the Borough

Select Flushing as the city. Note: if you enter just "F" in this box for a city in Queens, you will see results from both Flushing and Far Rockaway. If you select Westchester and Flushing, you will see no data at all.

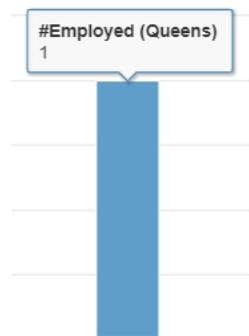
The Column Chart

The X-axis shows all the types of income currently in use (and subject to change):

- **UIB** Unemployment Insurance Benefits
- **TANF** Temporary Assistance for Needy Families
- **SNAP** Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (food stamps)
- **WIC** Women Infants Children (nutrition)
- **SSI** Supplemental Security Income
- **VET** Veterans Benefits
- **SSDI** Social Security Disability Insurance
- **Pension**
- **SSR** Social Security Retirement
- **TDI** Temporary Disability Insurance
- **EFSP** Emergency Food and Shelter Program
- **CS** Child Support
- **FHEPS** Family Homelessness and Eviction Prevention Supplement
- **Foster** Foster Child support
- **WC** Workers' Compensation
- **Roommate** shared expenses
- **PublicAsst** Public Assistance



Each type is represented by a different color. The sources of income for 2020 in Flushing, Queens included Employment, SNAP, Social Security Disability, and Social Security Retirement. Many clients may have more than one type, for example UIB (unemployment insurance benefits) and SNAP (food stamps).

If you hover the cursor over the top of a column, you will see the details of how many clients for that type of income.

The Search was for clients in Flushing, Queens in 2020. Click on the “+” to EXPAND to see all the clients’ data.

When a client (or staff member) fills out a client application, there are check boxes to mark to indicate the client receives that type of income. So in the table, each row is a client (the ClientID is at the beginning of the row. The columns are the types of income. In each column, a “1” indicates a checkmark, and a “0” means no checkmark for that type. At the top of each column is the number of clients checking that type of income and the percentage of the total. For example, 33% of Flushing clients in 2020 had employment income. And 33% received food stamps (SNAP). In this search, there is a total of one for each of the four types we see in the Bar Chart.

Why so few clients? Surely there were more Flushing clients during 2020? This sources of income data was previously jotted down in one column in ACCESS, and often missing. While the data from ACCESS has been reformatted to show checkmarks in the proper columns, there will remain incomplete information for past clients. It should be easier to enter going forward. Part of the first page is shown here:

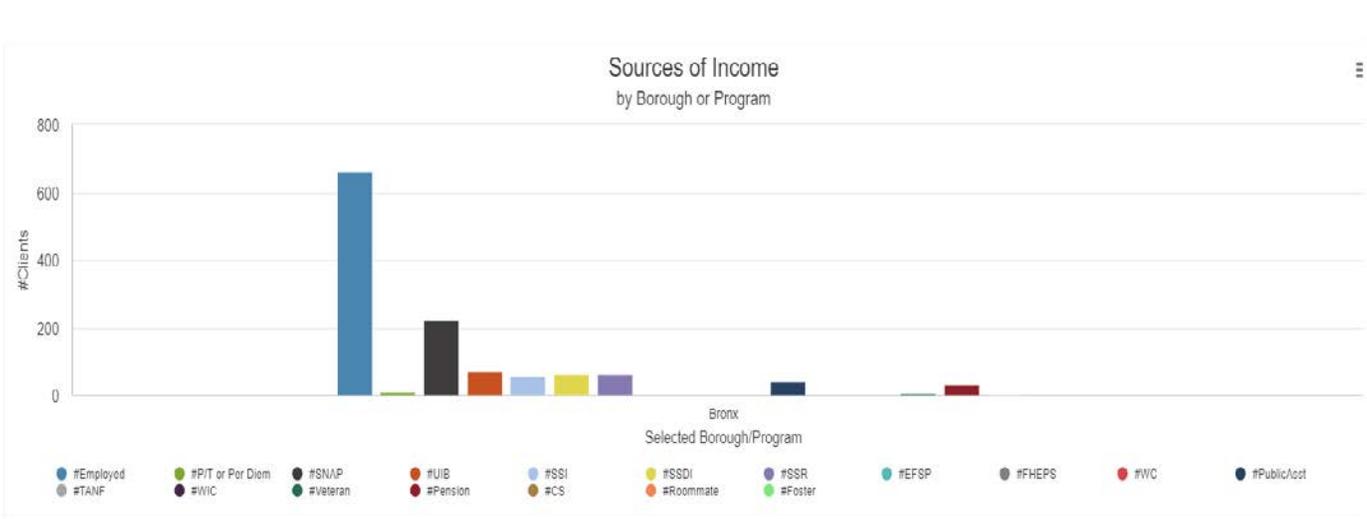

Use **Search Again** to change the search criteria. This time, we select no dates and just Bronx for the borough.



Some of the bars in the chart above are difficult to read. While you can hover over each column to see the total for that income category, you can also hide the largest column or bars to rescale the chart to see the shorter bars better. This does not change the data, just the display. For example, Employment is the largest column. If you click on the color dot for that column, the #Employed column will be hidden and the chart rescaled. To see **only** recipients of Social Security Retirement, Pensions, and Veterans benefits, hide all the other categories:



**Tabular Data:** Return now to our previous search of all Sources of Income for Bronx clients in 2020.

The table shows that of the 869 clients (Bronx, 2020), 663 were Employed full time, 11 P/T, 72 received UIB, 223 were SNAP recipients, 57 got SSI, 65 Disability, and so on. There are 35 pages of monthly client data.
